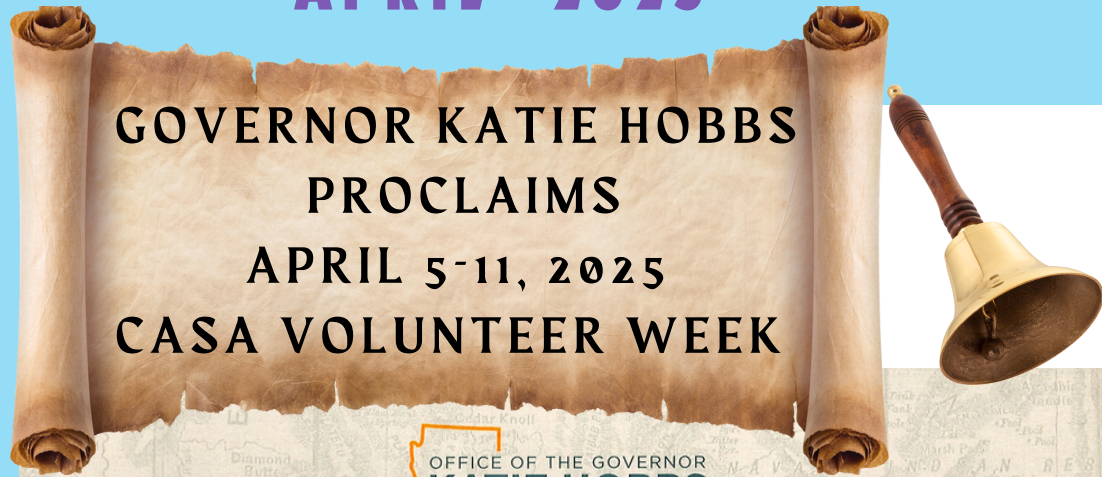

## GOVERNOR KATIE HOBBS PROCLAIMS APRIL 5-11, 2025 CASA VOLUNTEER WEEK



### Proclamation

**WHEREAS**, the health, safety, and well-being of Arizona's children are fundamental to the prosperity of our communities and the future of our state; and

**WHEREAS**, each year, thousands of Arizona children enter the child welfare system due to reports of abuse or neglect, and these children often experience uncertainty, instability, and a lack of consistent support during a challenging time in their young lives; and

**WHEREAS**, a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) is a trained volunteer who is appointed by a judge to advocate for the best interests of a child in foster care, ensuring their voice is heard and their needs are met in court proceedings, placement decisions, and other critical areas; and

**WHEREAS**, CASA volunteers provide an invaluable service by building trusted relationships with their appointed youth, advocating for timely permanency and stability, promoting more positive outcomes, and helping children pursue their dreams and lead self-determined lives; and

**WHEREAS**, in Arizona, CASA volunteers work diligently in partnership with judges, attorneys, social workers, and community partners to ensure these children have the support, resources, and opportunities to thrive, now and in the future; and

**WHEREAS**, the work of CASA volunteers has a profound and lasting impact on the lives of vulnerable children, providing them with a consistent, compassionate presence and helping to restore a more hopeful future; and

**WHEREAS**, CASA Volunteer Week provides an opportunity to recognize and honor the dedication of CASA volunteers and raise awareness about the urgent need for more individuals to step forward and make a difference in the lives of children in foster care.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Katie Hobbs, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim April 5 - 11, 2025, as

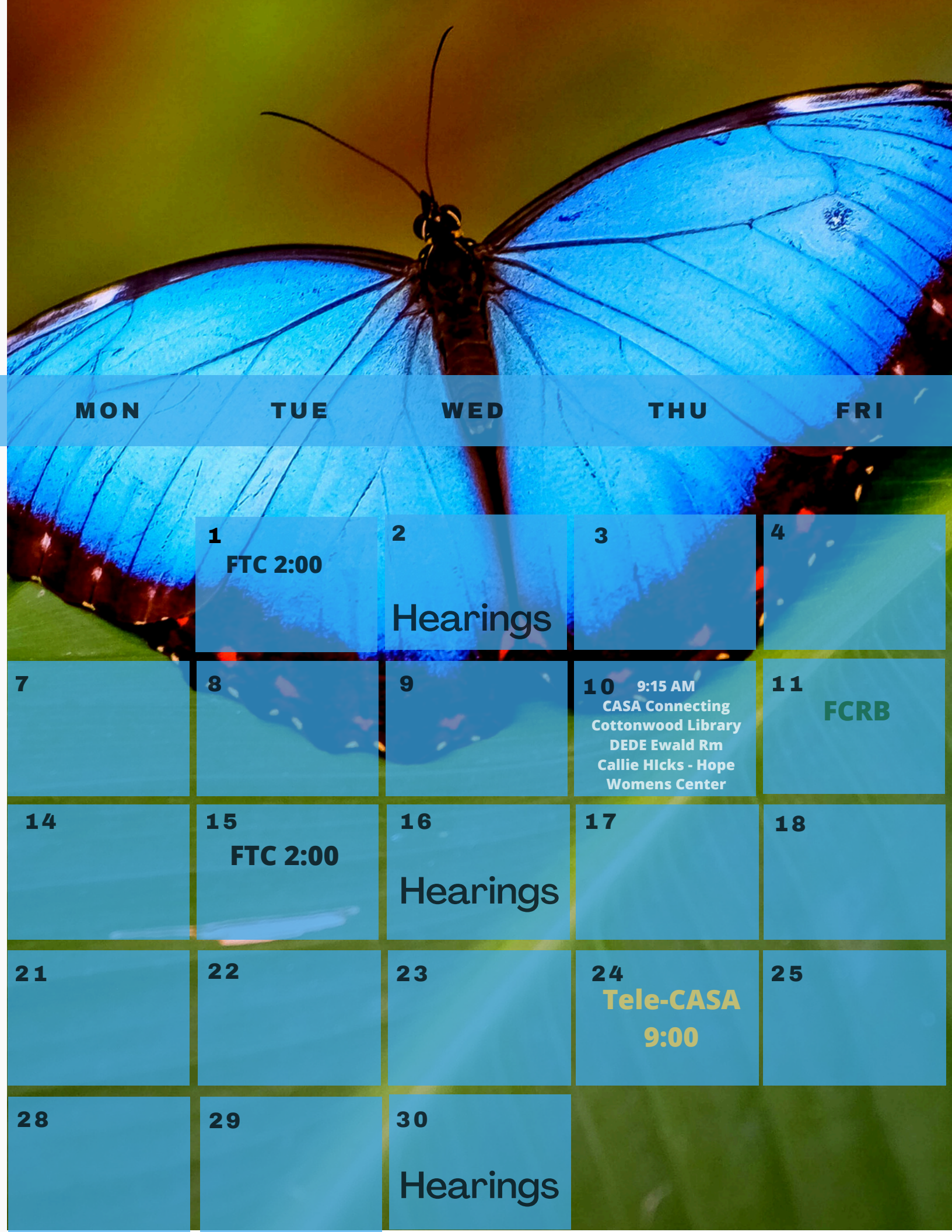

# Court Ordered Services



During a CASA Connecting Meeting last month, I asked my group of CASAs (which consisted mostly of CASAs who have 5+ years of CASA experience), to think back when they first started as a new CASA, and what kind of information they would have liked to have more accessibility to when starting out on their first case? The CASAs all agreed that having a list of brief detailed explanations for services that may be court ordered for the child(ren) and parent(s) at the Preliminary Protective Hearing would have been helpful.

Some of the CASAs who have years of experience have expressed their continued challenges understanding court ordered services even after reviewing the Preliminary Protective Order and the list of court ordered services explanation. (CASAs, if you are not familiar with the list of court ordered services, please reach out to your coordinator). At times, some CASAs still find it challenging to keep all of the services straight in regard to what agency provides the service and what each service offers to the child(ren) and or parent(s). As coordinators, we know how challenging this can be for CASAs, especially when you are preparing your court report. For example, a CASA may be unsure of the differences between the Nurturing Parenting Program and Family Connections Program and if one or both of the parents are participating and which program they are participating in.

However, CASAs you are in luck! Not only do you have the Preliminary Protective Order and list of court ordered services to reference as discussed above, but you also have multiple options available to you in order to gain a better understanding of these court ordered services that you are interested in obtaining more information on. We know how much our CASAs love reading the CASA newsletter 😊 Within the CASA newsletter, CASAs can find information about attending monthly CASA Connecting Meetings in Prescott and/or the Verde throughout the year, which also may include guest speakers from agencies pertaining to a court ordered service or services that you as a CASA may have found wanting more information on as well as many other wonderful services you may discover along the way for families. In addition, the Prescott and Verde CASA offices provide CASAs the opportunity to participate in numerous online trainings as well as in-person trainings throughout the year that may discuss a particular court ordered service or services that a CASA is interested in learning more about. CASAs, if you find that there is not a training available for a service you would like more information on, please reach out to your coordinator to discuss as we want to make sure you have as much information available to you throughout your amazing time as a CASA volunteer!

# Meet & Greet WITH DCS & CASA

On Thursday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, the CASA office hosted a meet and greet luncheon for all the stakeholders in the Yavapai Dependency Court. In attendance were the Department of Child Safety case workers and managers, Court Appointed Special Advocates, the Cross Over Youth Juvenile Probation Officer, Cross Over Youth Juvenile Probation Supervisor, and the Assistant Attorney General. This was a chance for everyone involved with the dependency process to air grievances, ask questions, and appreciate each other.

Questions were submitted ahead of time and read aloud to the group so that anyone could volunteer to answer and explain the reason behind their answer. The crowd was polite and genuinely interested in the discussion. The result was an appreciation and understanding of each other's processes and challenges that come with working with families in dependency court.

# DEPENDENCY 101 CLASS - SHARED PARENTING PANEL



Shared parenting refers to the collaboration between an out-of-home caregiver, such as a foster parent or kinship, and the child's birth parent(s). This relationship plays a crucial role in helping the child adjust to their new environment and feel as comfortable as possible during their transition while working to strengthen or maintain a relationship with their parent(s).

The Shared Parenting Panel will consist of foster or kinship placements along with the parent(s) in a Q&A format sharing their experiences of co-parenting while navigating through the dependency process.

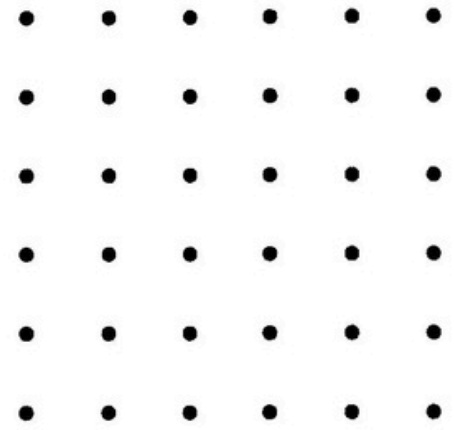

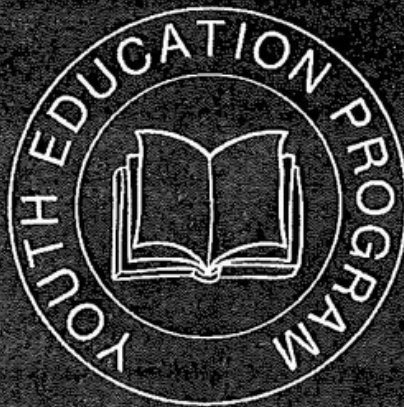
